What is Falun Gong (Falun Dafa)?

Falun Gong, also known as Falun Dafa, is a spiritual discipline that includes gentle exercises and meditation. Its principles are based on "Truthfulness-Compassion-Tolerance." Persons who practice regularly find it to bring them better health, reduced stress, inner peace, and deepened morals.

Falun Gong, which has roots in ancient Chinese culture, was first introduced to the public in China by Li Hongzhi in 1992. The practice was quickly spread by word of mouth throughout China and then beyond. Today, Falun Gong is practiced by over 100 million people in more than 70 countries.

Why the Persecution in China?

In July 1999, the Chinese communist regime outlawed a popular mind-body practice called Falun Gong (or Falun Dafa), after it was discovered that it had attracted more adherents than the Communist Party had members.

Fearing that this spiritual practice had grown too popular in his atheist state, then-dictator Jiang Zemin declared that "no measures are too excessive" to wipe out Falun Gong.

Since then, hundreds of thousands of Falun Gong practitioners have been illegally detained in prisons, labour camps, and so-called mental hospitals for refusing to recant their beliefs. They are routinely beaten, tortured, raped, and injected with mind-altering drugs. Over 2,800 have been confirmed dead as a result of torture.

Behind high walls

'No One Has Ever Come out Alive'

A long-time Chinese journalist recently revealed the "SuJiaTun" concentration camp, which is in Shenyang City, Liaoning Province, where more than 6000 Falun Gong practitioners are detained. The detainees are being tortured and killed and their organs harvested and sold for profit by the state. The camp is equipped with many doctors and a crematorium to burn the bodies and eliminate evidence. No detainee is known to have come out alive.

Word of concentration camps for Falun Gong practitioners has circulated for several years. An October, 2000, report by Agence France Presse told of two concentration camps in China, both specifically for Falun Gong detainees. The camps were said to have been built in northwest and northeast China, with each capable of holding up to 50,000 persons.

Organs Harvested from Live Prisoners

A former employee at the Liaoning Thrombosis Treatment Center of Integrated Chinese and Western Medicine confirmed the shocking news. She revealed that her ex-husband was one of the main surgeons in the concentration camp. He is a brain surgeon, and was mainly in charge of cornea removal.

She said that **organs from three quarters of the 6,000 Falun Gong practitioners were harvested when they were still alive** and their bodies were cremated immediately after the organs were removed.

New Witness Tells of 36 China Concentration Camps

A third witness who identifies himself as a veteran medical doctor and has served in the Shenyang military zone confirmed fears surrounding a recently-alleged camp while indicating that the scope of the problem far exceeds that previously imagined.

A total of some 36 similar camps exist throughout China, he says. Falun Gong practitioners are sent to the camps when "occasion calls for it," with the three largest camps being in the northern China provinces of Heilongjiang, Jilin, and Liaoning. The fifth-largest camp, located in the Jiutai district of Jilin, holds as many as 14,000-plus Falun Gong at a time.

The largest camp, codenamed "672-S," is said to hold over 120,000 people, among whom are Falun Gong and other prisoners of conscience.

According to the source, captive Falun Gong adherents are shipped in "sealed freight trains" to and from the camps, with as many as 5,000 being transferred in a single day.

China's practice of harvesting organs from executed prisoners, including political dissidents, is believed to have begun in 1979. The Chinese regime has been under scrutiny from the international community since the 1980s for selling prisoners' organs without the donor's or their families' permission.

Investigation by WOIPFG on Sujiatun Camp

According to the initial investigation by the World Organization to Investigate the Persecution of Falun Gong (WOIPFG), the operation of the Sujiatun death camp started as early as 2001 and the "business" reached its peak in 2002. Near a hospital in Sujiatun, the death camp facility is underground because it was built upon the existing infrastructure of an aerial defense facility.

WOIPFG stated, "The organ harvesting operation is conducted on living Falun Gong practitioners. Because the process is extremely brutal, most of the medical professionals involved in the organ harvesting have suffered extreme psychological trauma. Some common symptoms they share include insomnia and nightmares. Some people have chosen to hire prostitutes to relieve the psychological pressure. Certain individuals have even attempted suicide because of the extreme psychological pressure.

Americans Fear for Friends, Relatives Missing in China

With thousands of Chinese Falun Gong practitioners having disappeared in recent years, many Americans say they fear that their friends and relatives who practice Falun Gong in China may have been sent to Sujiatun.

One of them is Dr. Wanqing Huang from New York. He said that his younger brother Xiong Huang was forced to leave home in 2001 after being detained in a labor camp for more than one year for not giving up his practice of Falun Gong. Dr. Huang hasn't heard from his brother since April 19, 2003. He is extremely concerned about his brother's safety and calls for all possible support to help rescue his brother.
